The Humane Society of North Texas Has 60 Horses & Donkeys Available for Adoption During the ASPCA® Help A Horse Home Challenge

Fort Worth, Texas, May 8, 2019

The Humane Society of North Texas (HSNT) is participating in the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals® (ASPCA®) Help A Horse Home Challenge, which began on April 26th. As part of the Challenge, HSNT will be hosting several open house events at HSNT's Joshua, Texas ranch in conjunction with each of the Triple Crown races (the Kentucky Derby, Preakness Stakes, and Belmont Stakes.) HSNT hopes to find homes for the horses and donkeys currently in its care and educate the public about responsible ownership of equines.

HSNT currently has 60 equines available for adoption ranging from mini donkeys to thoroughbred horses. The equines came to HSNT from owners who could no longer care for the animals or were transferred from equine rescue groups wanting to save the animals' lives. By participating in the ASPCA Help A Horse Home Challenge, HSNT is eligible to receive a portion of \$150,000 in grant funding if it secures the biggest increase in adoptions compared to the same two-month contest period during the previous year.

The first HSNT open house was held last Saturday in honor of the Kentucky Derby and included mock mint juleps and a rose sash for equines. The next events will be held on May 18th and June 8th. The public is invited to visit the HSNT Ranch in Joshua, Texas, and see the equines available for adoption, or visit the HSNT website at hsnt.org.
